In January, we hosted the first meeting of Top Shelf, a new cookbook club. Participants are encouraged to find a recipe that meets the chosen theme, prepare it, and bring it to the club meeting for others to try. Top Shelf is an opportunity to sample new food, swap recipes, and talk about cooking and food. In January, the theme centered around comfort food. One participant, Ramona Lena, brought in a family favorite that is a staple in her home called Sicilian Potatoes and Ditalini.



The theme for February's meeting is Sweet Confections, and March is You Say Potato. Limited space is available. Those interested in participating can sign up online.

#### Sicilian Potatoes + Ditalini Recipe

1 red onion chopped

2 tbsp olive oil

 $1\ 1/4\ lb.$  yellow potato, peeled & cut 1/4" cubes

Cayenne pepper

Coarse salt

3 cups chicken stock, divided

1 cup ditalini


2 tbsp parsley

1/4 cup fresh cheese

Cook onion in oil for 10 minutes on medium heat. Add potatoes, cayenne, and salt. Cook for 1 minute. Add 2 cups of chicken stock and bring to a boil. Simmer until tender. Add ditalini + 1 cup of chicken stock. Bring to a boil, cover, and turn off heat. Let sit for 15 minutes. Stir in parsley and cheese. Drizzle with olive oil.

#### **Book Review**

The Measure by Nikki Erlick is a thought provoking novel that makes the reader question how they would spend the remainder of their lives, if they were



to know precisely when it would end. In this debut novel, everyone in the world wakes up one day to find a box on their doorstep containing a length of string which correlates to the amount of time they have left on earth. For those choosing to open the box, learning whether they are a "shortstringer" or "long-stringer" impacts their life and relationships in varied and unforeseen ways. The availability of this knowledge also raises questions regarding an individual's right to privacy, the right of the government to compel key employees to disclose their life expectancy, and whether political candidates should be required to divulge this information to voters. I enjoyed following the lives of the characters throughout this book as they navigated their new realities, and pondering what I would do if I were in their shoes.


### **Displays**


### **Program Highlights**

#### **Book Review**

The Downstairs Girl - Stacey Lee The Downstairs Girl by Stacey Lee is a young adult historical fiction novel. This story highlights issues such as having no voice and the challenges of racial and gender issues. Seventeen-year-old Jo Kuan is a Chinese American living in Atlanta, Georgia, in the 1890s'. Let go from her job at a



milliner's shop because she was a "saucebox," Jo is now forced back into taking a maid job for a spoiled rich teen. Jo and Old Gin, who she affectionately thought of as "grandfather," have always lived secretly in the basement below a newspaperman's family and their business. Jo discovers that the family above them might lose their home and business, as the newspaper is not doing well, and they may have to close. Jo is inspired to write a column for the newspaper to help them build their readership. Her column, "Dear Miss Sweetie," becomes the talk of the town for its modern and controversial opinions. Meanwhile, in her daily life, Jo struggles to survive. Don't be deterred from this heartfelt and compelling story because it is a YA novel.

This also gives librarians a chance to see if well-loved copies need a replacement or quick repair. ### **Book Review**

Fifty Haiku - Kent Harris

After reading this book, I wrote the below Haiku.

A story of life Time seems to pass so quickly I've had a good life

What is Haiku? It is a form of poetry which describes a moment in time – it can be elusive if you don't record it quickly as it is simply what is happening in this place at this moment and usually in nature, but not always. The Haiku format is simple – there are no more than 17 syllables within three lines. Typically the first line of Haiku has 5 syllables, the second line has 7 syllables and the third has 5 syllables.

This book is 15 years in the making. The author had written these individual Haiku over the years, keeping them "stuffed in a journal not knowing what to do with them." Then one day he decided to randomly put them in what he considered an interesting order to create his book, not realizing what its ultimate purpose would be, other than a collection of Haiku. The title tells you how many Haiku are in the book – 50 – each one is numbered. The book was published in Japan and as you read this work notice the special paper fold along with its unusual binding. However, it wasn't until I spoke with the author regarding his work stating "This is your life, thank you for sharing it with me". His thoughtful response, "I never realized it before your comment—it is my life and I've had a good life!"

I challenge you to read this quick and powerful book and then write your own Haiku, your



own story!

#### **Book Review**

#### The Girl from Earths End - Tara Dairman

Imagine an island called Earth's End—a remote island where the only contact with the outside is a monthly visit from an orange mail boat—formerly a transport for the renowned oranges once grown on the island before the blight that wiped out all but one tree. As an infant, Henna arrived as an unexpected package to the only inhabitants of the island.



Her two papas have very different personalities. Niall is an artist and homemaker and Joachim, a fisherman and an organizer keeping them to a daily schedule. Henna becomes a plant expert experimenting with different locations, soils, compost and nutrients that would help the plants thrive.

Finding that her dear Papa Niall is very ill and believing that there is a unique plant (the Nightwalker) that would cure him, she embarks upon a quest to recover it. She learns of a seed repository at St. Basil's, a botanical school for girls, applies and is accepted. There she rooms with P (or Pierre or Pierrette) who is resourceful and often sneaky, and Lora, a wheelchair-ridden (though wishing to be more independent) daughter of a wealthy opportunist. Though having different motives, the trio teams up to find the elusive Nightwalker seeds.

Though a book for 8-12 year olds, it includes a roster of complex characters (and their motives are not as clear-cut as they seem) as well as themes of botany, art, mystery and humor.

#### **Book Review**

What the Dead Know: Learning About Life as a New York City Death Investigator

is the memoir of Barbara Butcher, who worked more than twenty years for the New York City Medical Examiner's Office. It was interesting to learn about what a Death Investigator does and how the job affected the author and her life. A Death Investigator is called to all kinds of dead bodies - murders, suicides, and natural deaths. It was fascinating to learn how they examine the bodies and the clues they look for to understand a person's final moments. Barbara tells about a time when she was almost killed, another case where she was sure a man had been murdered and knew who did it but was unable to prove it, and what happens when a body falls from a great height. She also details what it was like to



be in New York City on September 11, 2001, when the Twin Towers fell, and how hard they worked to identify the body parts that were collected in order to give the victim's families some closure. As a recovering alcoholic and one of only a few women in her office, Barbara discusses how her job impacted her personal life in both good and bad ways. She had a very supportive boss who was a mentor and friend, and despite challenging work conditions, earned the respect of her peers and police officers whom she worked alongside. However, the stress of the job and long hours took a toll on her relationships and mental health. Although the book was a bit gruesome and difficult to read in parts, I enjoyed learning how deaths are investigated, and how that job impacts you as a person. - *Laura F. - Youth Services Clerk*
